## **APPLICATION/CONTRACT GUIDELINES**

**Booth Space:** Spaces are 10'x 10' and the City of Chandler will provide 1 table and 2 chairs for each booth. There will be a limited amount of covered spaces that will be given to applicants on a first come first serve basis. Preference will be given to food booths or booths requiring electricity or water. Covered spaces will not require a white covered canopy. For uncovered spaces, artist must have a canopy (any color) and weights. Tarps, plastic sheeting, blankets or similar will not be allowed. We will be on cement so weights are required to anchor your tent on the ground.

**Set Up:** Artists are encouraged to stop at Artist Check-in beginning on Friday, October 8 from 3 pm until 7 pm and Saturday, October 9 from 7 am until 8:30 am. Booths must be set up by 8:30 am, open by 9 am both days and remain open until 5:00 pm on Saturday and 4:00 pm on Sunday. Applicant must claim their assigned booth space no later than 7:30 am on Saturday or your booth and fee will be forfeited. Your acceptance letter will have your assigned check-in time.

**Show Hours:** Friday, October 7, 2011 – 3 pm to 9 pm, Saturday October 8, 2011 - 9 am to 6 pm and Sunday October 9, 2011 - Noon to 4 pm.

**Tear Down:** Sunday, 4 pm to 6 pm

**Booth Closing:** Packing and leaving the show before the end of show on Sunday, October 9 at 4 pm is strictly prohibited. Leaving the show early will jeopardize your participation in future shows.

**Cancellation Policy & Rights Reserved:** Once an artist has been confirmed, there will be no refunds due to cancellations for any reason. The City of Chandler reserves the right to assign booths due to cancellations or no shows. No-shows are those artists who have not set up their assigned booths by opening times each day.

**Security and Waiver:** Artists are responsible for their art and booth during the Market. Security will be provided the nights of Friday, October 7 and Saturday, October 8. The City of Chandler, its agents, employees or volunteers are not responsible for loss, damage, vandalism, casualty, injury or theft. No alcohol, illicit drugs or firearms are allowed on the market grounds.

**Sales Tax:** Each artist is responsible to register with State of Arizona Revenue departments. Artists must collect, report and pay appropriate city, county and state sales taxes for all items sold at the market.

**Loading, Unloading & Parking:** A loading and unloading area is designated for your convenience. Immediately after unloading, please move your vehicle to any of the available parking lots. Vehicles are subject to towing if not in proper parking area or blocking street traffic.

**License and Sales Tax:** Each artist is responsible to register with the State of Arizona Revenue (480) 545-3500, ask for a License Compliance Officer. **Artists must collect report and pay appropriate taxes for all items sold at the market if applicable.** Visit [www.revenue.state.az.us](http://www.revenue.state.az.us) if you have any questions or call (602) 255-2060 Toll-free from 520 or 928 area code (800) 843-7196. **Your AZ Tax License must be posted in your booth space in your booth space at the market.**

**Security and Waiver:** Artists are responsible for their art and booth during the festival. Security will be provided overnight on Friday, October 7 and Saturday, October 8. The City of Chandler, its agents, employees or volunteers are not responsible for loss, damage, vandalism, casualty, injury or theft. No alcohol, illicit drugs or firearms are allowed on the festival/school grounds.

**Payments:** Money orders or cashiers check will be accepted. No personal or company checks. Make money orders or cashiers check payable to City of Chandler – Indian Art Market. Improper method of payment will be returned.

**Location:** This open-air market is held in Historic Downtown Chandler on the SW corner of Arizona Avenue and Chandler Blvd (in front of the Crowne Plaza San Marcos Resort), A.J. Chandler Park, 3 S. Arizona Ave.

### **REGULATIONS AND BOOTH POLICIES**

**Eligibility:** All Native American Artists must have proof of tribal affiliation. This is a **JURIED SHOW**. Only handmade or handcrafted Art and Craft work made completely by the exhibitor, with authenticity guaranteed, may be displayed at the Festival. Applicant's guarantee that all items displayed in the booth is of their **own creation**.

**Tribal Verification:** The Chandler Indian Art Market is open to artists who can provide proof of enrollment in a federal or state recognized tribe in the U.S. or First Nation of Canada. All artists applying will be required to submit verification of tribal affiliation

**Originality:** All work displayed must be designed and created by the exhibitor. All work must be hand crafted or hand made. No dealers or traders allowed.

**Artifacts & Ceremonial Objects:** Absolutely no sale or display of prehistoric or culturally sensitive artifacts as per "The Indian Arts and Crafts Act of 1990".

**Regulations:** Artists participating in the Chandler Indian Art Market must be in compliance with the Indian Arts and Crafts Acts of 1990 & 2000, a truth-in-advertising law that protects consumers, Native American artists, craftspeople, business, and Tribes. All artists are required to sell their own work and items displayed must be properly identified in accordance with the Native American Arts Festival Rules, Standards and Eligibility.

**Pottery:** Hand coiled or wheel thrown are preferred. Kiln-fired pots and pots made or decorated with commercial materials must be properly identified. Contemporary pottery forms are acceptable.

**Jewelry:** Only handmade jewelry may be sold. Natural turquoise does not need special labeling. Stabilized turquoise must be properly labeled. No block (turquoise/epoxy resins and dye) fake turquoise, imitation stones, synthetic opal, machine-made components (except findings) can be used. Not allowed are non-American Indian made heishi, stamped fetishes, nickel silver, and liquid silver or plated metals.

**Paintings & Drawings:** Paintings, drawings and graphics must be matted, framed or shrink-wrapped. No wet canvases will be available for sale. Paintings on canvas should be framed for its protection.

**Prints:** No xerographic-type mechanical reproductions, laser prints or photographs of original artwork are allowed. Limited edition prints, signed and numbered may not exceed 750.

**Weaving & Textiles:** Rugs, blankets, belts and purses must be handmade. All natural yarns and dyes are acceptable. Synthetic or acrylic yarn must be properly labeled. Sewing machine work is acceptable. Commercially made clothing, liquid embroidery or products made from commercial kits or patterns are not allowed.

**Dolls:** Dolls in traditional categories must use materials historically associated with its native culture. Artists are not to display dolls of tribes other than their own tribal affiliation.

**Bead, Quill & Leather:** No plastic pony beads or Grand Canyon “stringed” beads.

**Pets Prohibited:** No pets allowed on the festival grounds, except dogs assisting visually handicapped persons. Artists bringing pets will be asked to leave grounds and forfeit their booth space.
