Primary Master Plan Priorities

- Consolidate Training Unit staff and functions
- Relocate Forensic Services Section
- Expand Records Unit / Public Lobby
- Renovate Victim Services, Family and Sex Crimes
- Relocate Special Assignment Unit
- Consolidate Main Station Criminal Investigation Bureau
- Consolidate Main Station Field Operations Bureau
- Construct a driver's training EVOC facility
- Construct a communications backup facility
- Enlarge Chandler Height's Fitness Room
- Renovate Desert Breeze Impound Unit
- Reorganize Main Station Police Administration wing

Top Priority: Police Training Facility

- ▶ Facilities Master Plan identified the need for additional police training facilities and the consolidation of all police training staff and training functions to a centralized training site to improve training effectiveness
- ▶ Presently, training staff and functions are housed at three separate locations with improvised defensive tactics space, limited classroom space, limited storage space, limited classroom technology, inability to host advanced training, decentralized training staff, and an inadequate range

Fire, Health & Medical Training Facility

► Existing

- History of land
- 5 story drill/burn tower
- Training Officer Offices
- Locker rooms
- Three classrooms
- SCBA Shop
- Storage
- Misc. training props
- Outdoor auditorium
- Approximately 5 acres undeveloped

► Plans

- Add state-of-the-art burn building (design was completed in 2008)
- Large vehicle storage building
- More offices
- More classrooms
- Indoor auditorium
- Tactical village

Chandler Public Safety Partnership

- ▶ Co-locate police training facility at Fire Training Center
- ▶ Construct shared work space (multi-purpose auditorium, classrooms, tactical village)
- ▶ Sell Armstrong Way land site (202 and McQueen) originally slated for police driving training course
