SUBJECT: RESOLUTION NO. 4879 AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF CHANDLER, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE CITY OF CHANDLER PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY, TO EXECUTE AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY OF PHOENIX, THROUGH THE CITY OF PHOENIX HOUSING DEPARTMENT, TO ALLOW THE USE OF PHOENIX'S HOUSING CHOICE VOUCHER VETERAN AFFAIRS SUPPORTIVE HOUSING PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS WITHIN THE JURISDICTIONAL BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF CHANDLER.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends City Council adopt Resolution No. 4879 authorizing the City of Chandler, in conjunction with the City of Chandler Public Housing Authority, to execute an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with the City of Phoenix through the City of Phoenix Housing Department (COP) to allow the use of Phoenix's Housing Choice Voucher Veteran Affairs Supportive Housing Program participants within the jurisdictional boundaries of the City of Chandler.

BACKGROUND: The City of Phoenix Housing Department was awarded and administers the Housing Choice Veteran Affairs Supportive Housing Program (VASH) Vouchers provided by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. VASH applicants are referred to the Phoenix Housing Department from the Department of Veteran Affairs (VA) for housing assistance and are required to be engaged in supportive services with VA staff while using the VASH Voucher.

The City of Phoenix wishes to expand the cities where VASH participants may live to include other Valley cities. This principally includes

cities that abut the City of Phoenix borders. The City of Phoenix is working to execute individual IGA's with each of these communities in order to allow VASH participants to look for housing in communities close to Phoenix.

DISCUSSION: The City of Chandler Housing and Redevelopment Division acts as the Public Housing Authority for the City of Chandler. Housing Division staff supports the IGA request as it will expand housing location options for Veterans for Phoenix, Chandler and other Valley cities. Under the IGA, the COP will administer all aspects of the VASH program, including certifications and inspections. The VA will continue to provide the ongoing case management. Chandler will have no direct responsibility for implementation for participants of Phoenix's VASH program. Chandler is only being asked to allow VASH participants to have the opportunity to lease housing within Chandler's jurisdictional boundaries. The IGA has an initial term of two years with an option to extend the term for two additional one year periods.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS: None

PROPOSED MOTION: Move Council adopt Resolution No. 4879 authorizing the City of Chandler, in conjunction with the City of Chandler Public Housing Authority, to execute an Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Phoenix, through the City of Phoenix Housing Department, to allow the use of Phoenix's Housing Choice Voucher Veteran Affairs Supportive Housing Program participants within the jurisdictional boundaries of the City of Chandler.

RESOLUTION NO. 4879

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHANDLER, ARIZONA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF CHANDLER, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE CITY OF CHANDLER PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY, TO EXECUTE AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY OF PHOENIX, THROUGH THE CITY OF PHOENIX HOUSING DEPARTMENT, TO ALLOW THE USE OF PHOENIX'S HOUSING CHOICE VOUCHER VETERAN AFFAIRS SUPPORTIVE HOUSING PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS WITHIN THE JURISDICTIONAL BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF CHANDLER.

WHEREAS, the City of Phoenix Housing Department (COP) administers the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Housing Choice Voucher Veteran Affairs Supportive Housing (VASH) program which combines voucher rental assistance for homeless veterans and their families with case management and clinical services provided by the Department of Veteran Affairs medical center and clinics; and

WHEREAS, on occasion, VASH program participants may desire to lease housing outside of the jurisdiction of the City of Phoenix and in the City of Chandler; and

WHEREAS, the City of Chandler and the City's Public Housing Authority believes it would be beneficial to the VASH program and area VASH program participants to accommodate participants requests to lease inside the City of Chandler; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) for the Housing Choice Voucher Veteran Affairs Supportive Housing Program, between the Phoenix Housing Department and the City of Chandler, wishes to enter into a IGA to allow City of Phoenix VASH program participants the option to lease housing in the City of Chandler.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Chandler, Arizona, as follows:

SECTION ONE. The City of Chandler, acting by, for and through the City of Chandler Public Housing Authority (PHA) is hereby authorized to enter into an IGA with the COP.

SECTION TWO. Authorizing and directing the Mayor/Chairman of the City of Chandler, Public Housing Authority, or his designated representative, to execute the IGA with the COP.

**INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT
FOR THE HOUSING CHOICE VOUCHER
VETERAN AFFAIRS SUPPORTIVE HOUSING PROGRAM
BETWEEN THE CITY OF PHOENIX HOUSING DEPARTMENT
AND the CITY OF CHANDLER**

This Intergovernmental Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into this 15th day of July, 2015, between the Housing Department of the City of Phoenix ("COP"), a municipal corporation whose principal place of business is located at 251 W. Washington 4th Floor St. Phoenix, AZ 85004 and the City of Chandler ("PHA") whose principal place of business is located at 175 S. Arizona Ave. The Parties to this Agreement may be referred to collectively as the "parties" and individually as a "party".

RECITALS

WHEREAS, COP administer the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") Housing Choice Voucher ("HCV") Veteran Affairs Supportive Housing ("VASH") program which combines voucher rental assistance for homeless veterans and their families with case management and clinical services provided by the Department of Veteran Affairs medical center and clinics;

WHEREAS, on occasion VASH program participants may desire to lease housing outside the jurisdiction of their respective public housing authority;

WHEREAS, representatives of COP and PHA believe it would be mutually beneficial to their programs and participants to accommodate participant requests to lease outside the jurisdiction of the public housing authority; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes ("A.R.S.") Section 11-952, the parties are empowered to enter into agreements to contract for services or jointly exercise any powers common to the contracting parties and may enter into agreements with one another for joint or cooperative action or may form a separate legal entity, including a nonprofit corporation, to contract for or perform some or all of the services specified in the contract or agreement or exercise those powers jointly held by the contracting parties.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained in this Agreement agree to the below Terms & Conditions.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Agreement is for the PHA to contract with the COP to allow COP VASH participants ("Participants") to lease housing in the jurisdiction of the PHA.

2. COMPENSATION

There will be no compensation for any services described in this Agreement.

3. TERM

The term of this Agreement shall begin on the date first written above and will remain in effect through June 30, 2017 unless terminated as provided herein. If agreed by the parties, this Agreement may be extended two times for a period of one year each time.

4. OBLIGATIONS OF THE COP

- a. COP will perform all VASH contract administration duties associated with its VASH program requirements and the Phoenix Housing Department Housing Choice Voucher (“HCV”) Administrative Plan.
- b. For those Participants who would normally exercise the portability feature of a VASH housing choice voucher (“Voucher”) if they desired to live within the public housing authority jurisdiction of PHA, COP will administer the voucher while the Participant lives outside of the COP jurisdiction, but within the public housing authority jurisdiction of PHA.
- c. Duties shall include those duties within the normal course and scope of COP’s VASH program which include, but are not limited to, conducting Housing Quality Standard inspections (“HQS Inspection”) and contracting with owners of the properties where Participants will lease property.

5. OBLIGATIONS OF THE PHA

The PHA will allow Participants to reside in the public housing authority jurisdiction of the PHA without interference in COP’s VASH program or with Participants’ receipt of services. PHA will have no power or obligation related to COP’s VASH program. It is the understanding of the parties that the COP’s VASH program will be under the sole authority and responsibility of COP.

6. TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE

During the term of this Agreement, either party may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days’ prior written notice (the “Notice of Termination,”). The Notice of Termination shall specify the date upon which such termination becomes effective.

7. TERMINATION

Upon termination of this Agreement for any reason, any Participants residing in the public housing authority jurisdiction of the PHA shall be permitted to continue to live in the PHA jurisdiction under the terms of this Agreement until the Participant’s next annual recertification at which time the Participant will be required by COP to move unless the Participant’s Voucher is ported to PHA resulting in Participant no longer being a part of the COP VASH program, but rather a part of the PHA’s regular HCV program.

8. SUBCONTRACTING

PHA acknowledges COP subcontracts for HQS Inspection services. Any further subcontracting will not be permitted without the written notification from COP to the PHA within a reasonable time prior to contract execution.

9. ASSIGNMENT

Neither party shall assign this Agreement, in whole nor in part, without the prior written consent of the other party; any attempted assignment without such consent, will be null and void.

10. INDEMNIFICATION

COP and PHA shall indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless the other party and its officers, officials, agents, and employees (hereinafter referred to as "Indemnitee") from and against any and all claims, actions, liabilities, damages, losses, or expenses (including court costs, attorneys' fees, and costs of claim processing, investigation and litigation) (hereinafter referred to as "Claims") for bodily injury or personal injury (including death), or loss or damage to tangible or intangible property caused, in whole or in part, by the negligent or willful acts or omissions of each party or any of its owners, officers, directors, agents, employees or subcontractors.

11. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR STATUS

The relationship of the parties is that of independent contractors. Accordingly, the employees of each party is not entitled to any benefits provided to employees of the other party including, but not limited to, health benefits, enrollment in a retirement system, paid time off or other rights afforded the other party's employees. If any employees or subcontractors of a party assert a claim for wages or other employment benefits against the other party, the party's employees or subcontractors who asserted the claim will defend, indemnify and hold harmless the other party from all such claims.

12. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Agreement is held invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall continue valid and enforceable to the full extent permitted by law. Any changes in the governing laws, rules and regulations during the term of this Agreement shall apply, but do not require an amendment to the Agreement.

13. SURVIVING PROVISIONS

All provisions which, by the terms of reasonable interpretation, set forth rights and obligations that extend beyond termination of this Agreement will survive and remain in full force and effect. Termination of the Agreement will not release any party from any liability or obligation arising prior to the date of termination.

14. INTERPRETATION

No provision of this Agreement is to be interpreted for or against either party because that party or that party's legal representative drafted such provision, but this Agreement is to be construed as if drafted by all parties hereto.

15. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

COP and PHA shall comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations, standards, and executive orders, applicable to this Agreement and HCV-VASH including, but limited to, those specifically set forth in this Section. The laws and regulations of the State of Arizona shall govern the rights of the parties' performance of this Agreement and any dispute hereunder. Any action relating to this Agreement shall be commenced and maintained in a court of competent jurisdiction in Maricopa County, Arizona.

- A. This Agreement is subject to cancellation by either party pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-511.
- B. This Agreement is subject to the conflict of interest requirements set forth in A.R.S. § 38-504.
- C. To the extent provisions of A.R.S. § 41-4401 are applicable to this Agreement:
 - 1. Each party warrants it is in compliance with A.R.S. § 23-214(A).
 - 2. Each contractor and subcontractor shall warrant their compliance with all federal immigration laws and regulations that relate to their employees and their compliance with A.R.S. § 23-214(A). The provisions of this Subsection C must be included in any contract either party enters into with any and all of its contractors or subcontractors who provide services under this Agreement.
 - 3. A breach of a warranty under Subsection C shall be deemed a material breach of the Agreement that is subject to penalties up to and including termination of the Agreement.
 - 4. Each party retains the legal right to inspect the papers of any contractor or subcontractor employee who works on the contract to ensure that the contractor or subcontractor is complying with the warranty in this Subsection C.

16. PROVISIONS REQUIRED BY LAW

Any provision required by law to be in this Agreement is part of this Agreement as if fully stated herein.

17. WAIVER

No breach of any provision hereof can be waived unless in writing. Waiver of any one breach of any provision shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any breach of the same or any other provision hereof.

18. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement supersedes any and all other agreements between parties, constitutes the entire understanding and agreement of the parties.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, this Agreement for services is hereby agreed to by the parties. The parties and their representatives signing this Agreement are duly authorized agents of the parties and have full authority to enter into this Agreement on behalf of the parties. This Agreement will be in full force and effect only after it has been approved and executed by the duly authorized party representatives.
