

Chandler is positioned to be the heart of an emerging mega-region, the “Sun Corridor”.




With Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport just a short 20 minutes away, no location is out of reach. Phoenix-Mesa Gateway Airport offers an alternative for cargo and limited passenger service. Corporate aircraft owners also enjoy the convenience of Chandler Municipal Airport.

Additionally, Los Angeles, San Diego, Salt Lake City, El Paso, Albuquerque and Las Vegas are among a number of cities within a day’s drive.

As the southernmost city in Maricopa County, Chandler is positioned to be the center of a new mega-region, called the “Sun Corridor”.

Although Chandler has seen extraordinary growth over the last 25 years, the city has been planned for the future to provide balance by focusing on the creation of distinct employment corridors, investing in top notch infrastructure and building quality neighborhoods.





CHANDLER :: WORKFORCE

Companies including Intel, Orbital Sciences, Bank of America, Wells Fargo, Amkor, InfusionSoft, PayPal and Microchip have found available, productive employees at all skill levels. Proximity to four major freeways allows employers to easily draw workers from all over Greater Phoenix and neighboring southern cities. The City itself has a highly educated population with nearly 70 percent of the adult residents having attended college.





A strong policy foundation, proactive planning and political support have resulted in a community with a high quality of life and a desirable business environment.

Infrastructure

Chandler's experience with nationally recognized companies has enhanced our capacity to support the needs of high-tech and manufacturing businesses. This includes ensuring the City has superior infrastructure for future growth in these sectors.

Chandler's infrastructure includes:

- An extensive ultra-pure nitrogen pipeline.
- Robust high-speed and wireless telecommunication networks.
- Advanced water recycling methods.
- Redundant water system capable of delivering water under adverse conditions.
- Liberal utilities to commercial sites.
- Municipal airport with parallel runways and a heliport.

Inventory

A strong relationship with the commercial real estate community allows us to ensure ample inventory of commercial buildings in strategic geographic locations. Employers will find a variety of choices and unique competitive advantages within the North Chandler, Downtown, Price Corridor, Airpark Area and West Chandler employment corridors.

Pro-business local government

The actions of our pro-business local government have cultivated a place for progress. An authentic dedication to serving the needs of businesses and residents alike has helped Chandler maintain a high quality of life and the strategic economic growth of the City.

The City leadership's aggressive pursuit of timely capital improvement projects has helped place Chandler as one of the best outfitted cities for business.

Progressive Water Management

Chandler has long been a pioneer in advanced water management. The City controls water supplies sufficient to meet build-out demands and beyond. Chandler's robust water resources and its advanced underground water storage infrastructure ensure 100 percent of the City's commercial and industrial water needs are met.

Incentives

Arizona's new Competitiveness Package offers many new features and incentives allowing businesses to:

- Earn income tax credits up to \$9,000 for each new quality job.
- Obtain renewable energy income tax credits and property tax reductions.
- Receive up to \$1.5 million in reimbursable grants to train employees.
- Leverage up to a 34 percent research and development tax credit.
- Refundable tax credit for the establishment or expansion of manufacturing facilities, R & D operations for manufacturers, or headquarters of manufacturers. Equal to lesser of 10 percent of qualifying investment, \$20,000 per net new employee or \$30 million per taxpayer.

Phasing-in Between 2014-2017

- Take advantage of Arizona's 100 percent electable sales factor for multi-state corporations.
- Benefit from a 30 percent reduction in Arizona's corporate income tax rate.
- Capitalize on Arizona's reduced commercial property assessment ratio.


Incubators & Co-Working

CHANDLER :: MUNICIPAL AIRPORT

Chandler Municipal Airport (CHD) is located just 18 miles southeast of Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport. Chandler Municipal Airport is Greater Phoenix's convenient alternative for business aircraft as well as the leisure traveler. Chandler Municipal's location offers quick, easy access to anywhere in Greater Phoenix, including Arizona's largest employers, spas, golf, shopping, hotels, business resort and casinos. If your destination is Chandler, Mesa, Tempe, Scottsdale, Gilbert or Pinal County, add CHD to your flight plan.

Outstanding year-round flying conditions and an average of more than 350 Visual Flight Rules (VFR) days draw students and aviation enthusiasts from around the world. The Airport is also ideal for charter, sightseeing excursions, business flights, public safety, air support and humanitarian missions.

With nearly 200,000 take offs and landings each year, Chandler Municipal Airport is one of the nation's busiest general aviation airports. This facility offers:

- Airport open 24 hours/day.
- Air Traffic Control Tower 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. daily.

- Accommodates jets up to 30,000 pounds and a 79' wingspan.



Those who are on-the-go will find that Chandler offers a number of alternatives in amenity-rich condos and apartments. Rent or own, they can be found throughout the City.


Executive Luxury

COST OF LIVING Metro comparison






