SUBJ: Reconsideration of Weight Limits on Germann Road

I have been rethinking my vote regarding the establishment of weight limits on Germann Road.

I appreciate Councilmember Bob Caccamo's desire to make the street system around Tumbleweed Park safe and understand his concerns about the traffic generated by the proposed transfer station. This restriction will also negatively impact the other businesses that have been operating in the area without problems.

Therefore, having voted on the prevailing side, I request that this item be placed on the May 24, 2007 Council agenda for reconsideration.

I do not support this location for the Allied Waste transfer station. However, if the Maricopa Board of Supervisor's approves their project, it is my hope that Allied will work with the City to find a solution that addresses our safety concerns.
