LOOKING FOR A PLACE IN *Chandler* to ride your horse?

Then come visit Veterans Oasis Park, a 113-acre park located on the northeast corner of Lindsay and Chandler Heights roads. The designated horse trails running through the park are accessible through V-notches or horse stepover gates in the fence at three of the park's access points. Horseback riding is allowed **ONLY** on these designated trails and riders must ride in from outside areas, as there is no horse trailer parking nor loading/unloading of horses allowed within the park itself.
