- a) Mayor Kevin Hartke
 - i) Mayor Kevin Hartke made an appearance at our meeting and talked to our commission about his goals for the year, and his hopes for the future of our commission. He talked about 5 different topics the City of Chandler is working on to improve, and potentially wants our commission to focus on these areas in the future.
 - (1) Technology and Innovation Mayor Kevin Hartke discussed the work of local students he knows who are helping develop innovative technology that have a greater impact on others in our community, as well as emphasized how Chandler is advancing significantly in becoming a "smarter city". This specific technology was created by 10th grade students from Arizona College Prep (Erie Campus). He is helping with teaching these students on how to prosper in the business world, helping them with funding through grants, how to get a business up and running, etc.
 - (2) Renovation Discussed how the City of Chandler is working to renovate older parts of Downtown Chandler in order to give community members a cleaner and safer environment.
 - (3) Mobility Discussed the implementation of efficient transportation, and what Chandler is exactly doing to

- improve this in our community. Mayor Kevin Hartke also introduced his 20 year traffic plan to the commission in order to explain what the city is doing to make our streets safer.
- (4) Neighborhoods Discussed the work Chandler is doing in order to ensure that our neighborhoods are safe and clean, while also allowing for community members have an improved quality of life.
- (5) Quality of Life Discussed how the city is working to continue the quality of life in various aspects of the community. Chandler is currently one of the safest cities in the United States.
- ii) Mayor Kevin Hartke presented ideas for potential future projects that MYC can implement as community service projects:
 - (1) MYC can upgrade our roles as ambassadors in the City of Chandler. This means going out to schools and the greater community to talk about these 5 visions. Mayor Hartke emphasized the importance of getting more people's opinions on the implementation of this master plan.
 - (2) The mayor said he would like us to project our voices at as far as the national level, and in general increase our voice in where it's heard.MYC members can go out and talk to senior classes about civics, local government, voting, etc. The mayor said he wants our commission members to get in front of as many students as we can.
 - (3) Mayor Kevin Hartke wants to help spreading the word about our commission through his social media (potentially also making features on the Chandler City Hall's media). This will help give MYC a greater voice, as well as make us aware in more schools around the community.
- iii) Nivea asked how we can collaborate with the Mayor's office specifically to develop a plan to get MYC to implement his project ideas in the community. In his response, he said the way we can do this is by contacting him directly to talk to him about implementing these ideas.
- iv) Teah asked what Mayor Hartke entails for the prospective assemblies he wants to hold at high schools. His response was that he wants us as ambassadors to go into high schools and to talk to students to figure out what they want to hear at these respective assemblies. We're the people who'll help structure what topics to cover when hosting these assemblies.

- v) Penny Wallace Ross, a teacher from Basha High School, said she came with an organization called SGI. SGI (Sokka Gakkai International) is a Buddhist organization that works to recognize issues regarding youth in our community, as well as create value in society. She mentioned the possibility of linking up with MYC and Mayor Kevin Hartke to hold events that spread awareness about these issues.
- vi) Jack Mao asked what are Mayor Hartke's active plans to address gun violence in the community. Hartke responded that he doesn't "sign things to sign things", but will sign things that have an actionable plan. He wants to help with actionable plan in regards to this issue when it comes along.

- a) Chandler Fire Department Chief Jeff West and Firefighter Sara Ferguson
 - Started in Kyrene and Gilbert schools originally, and eventually branched out to more districts, including the Chandler Unified School District
 - ii) 91% of school shootings occur in high schools
 - (1) In the past, practices included arming SROs with long guns, writing up a "white paper" keeping up with present research, ghost cars (cars in the front to deter criminal from entering campus), and regular patrols of school campuses
 - (2) Currently, they have implemented heavy vests for SROs, PD workstations, go bags (bags with helpful things that are onsite in case of an actual emergency), as well as providing school faculty with SERT training
 - (3) In the future, they would like to implement threat assessments, drones, camera upgrades for school campuses, mentoring, and joint safety committees
 - iii) SERT is School Emergency Response Team (they communicate with Police and Fire), Accountability, etc.
 - (1) An example they provided was a devastating school shooting that occurred Parkland, Florida. Ms. Ferguson

discusses how a past student walked through the gates without being questioned and passed 8 people before lockdown initiated. She emphasized how schools and students need to fix this on their part.

- iv) How does it work when there is an emergency at a school? There is constant communication between agencies via radio, face to face, etc. Groups such as the SWAT team, police, fire, and rescue task force are notified immediately and send up to hundreds of officers to the targeted location
- v) SERT heavily emphasizes how students need to be empowered and speak up when they see something off-putting. Ms. Ferguson used the example of how social media is an important place to be fully aware, especially since that is a source that our generation uses a lot these days to express our emotions, issues we may be going through, etc. She also said that it's better to report something and it is a false alarm, rather than having it not reported and an unfortunate event occurs.
- vi) Tourniquets will soon be in every classroom (they are nylon bandages that are used to cover wounds)
- vii) Need to change the mindset about how it can't happen at your school because every location these days are vulnerable to an attack
- viii) Discussed discrepancies in how schools currently handle fire and lockdown drills and how we as members can go in and change it by increasing awareness
