City offices will be closed Monday, Nov. 12, for the Veterans Day holiday, and Thursday and Friday, Nov. 22-23, for the Thanksgiving holiday.

Trash and recycling will be collected as usual on Monday, Nov. 12. However, there will be no trash or recycling collection on Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 22.

If your regular collection day is Thursday, place your container at the curb on Friday by 6 a.m. Customers whose regular collection day is Friday should place their container at the curb on Saturday by 6 a.m.

The Recycling-Solid Waste Collection Center (RSWCC) will be closed on Monday, Nov. 12, in observance of Veterans Day, resuming operations on Thursday, Nov. 15 at 8 a.m. The RSWCC is also closed for the Thanksgiving holiday on Nov. 22-23, resuming operations on Saturday, November 24 at 8 a.m.

The estimated population for the City of Chandler as of Sept. 1, 2018, is 258,224.

Results of Chandler's 2018 election

In the Aug. 28 Primary Election, Chandler voters chose the next Mayor, returned two incumbents to the City Council and returned a former Councilmember to office. Current Councilmember Kevin Hartke ran unopposed and was elected Mayor with 36,373 votes. Councilmembers René Lopez and Terry Roe were re-elected with 20,299 and 19,453 votes, respectively. The third open seat on the Council will be filled by Matt Orlando, who received 17,762 votes. Proposition 408, the Alternative Expenditure Limitation also known as the Home Rule Option, was overwhelmingly approved with 85 percent (33,464 votes) of voters giving the City's elected officials the authority to set the City's annual spending limit based upon available revenues. Hartke, Lopez, Orlando and Roe will be sworn in during the Jan. 10, 2019, meeting of the City Council.

Resultados de las elecciones de Chandler en 2018

En las elecciones primarias celebradas el 28 de agosto, los electores de Chandler eligieron al próximo alcalde, decidieron mantener a dos concejales y regresaron a un exconcejal al concejo municipal. El actual concejal Kevin Hartke se postuló sin oposición y fue elegido con 36,373 votos. Los concejales René López y Terry Roe ganaron la reelección con 20,299 y 19,453 votos, respectivamente. El tercer escaño del concejo municipal será ocupado por Matt Orlando, quien recibió 17,762 votos. La proposición 408, la limitación a gastos alternativos también conocida como la opción de autonomía, fue abrumadoramente aprobada con un 85 por ciento de los votos (33,464), otorgando autoridad a los funcionarios municipales electos para establecer el límite de gasto anual de la Ciudad con base en los ingresos disponibles. Hartke, Lopez, Orlando y Roe prestarán juramento en la sesión del Concejo Municipal del 10 de enero de 2019.

Chandler Chuck Wagon Cook-off - Nov. 10



Ride the "Wave!"

Chandler's free Downtown shuttle

The City has contracted with Electric Cab North America, a Texas company, to provide Downtown visitors with free shuttle rides from parking garages to destinations throughout the Downtown area. The service, dubbed the "Wave," operates Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 5-9 p.m. The vehicles can be hailed by calling 602-730-5153. In addition to catching the Wave from any Downtown parking garage, patrons also can wave it down. In addition to driving, the shuttle operators will serve as ambassadors and be able to provide essential information about the various services and establishments available Downtown. The vehicles are wrapped with images of a scuba diver, mermaid and surfer, but they're headless. This will allow passengers to align their faces with the images, making for great selfie and photo opportunities. More information is available at chandleraz.gov/wave.
